You may be able to participate in the LIFT-AD Trial if you:



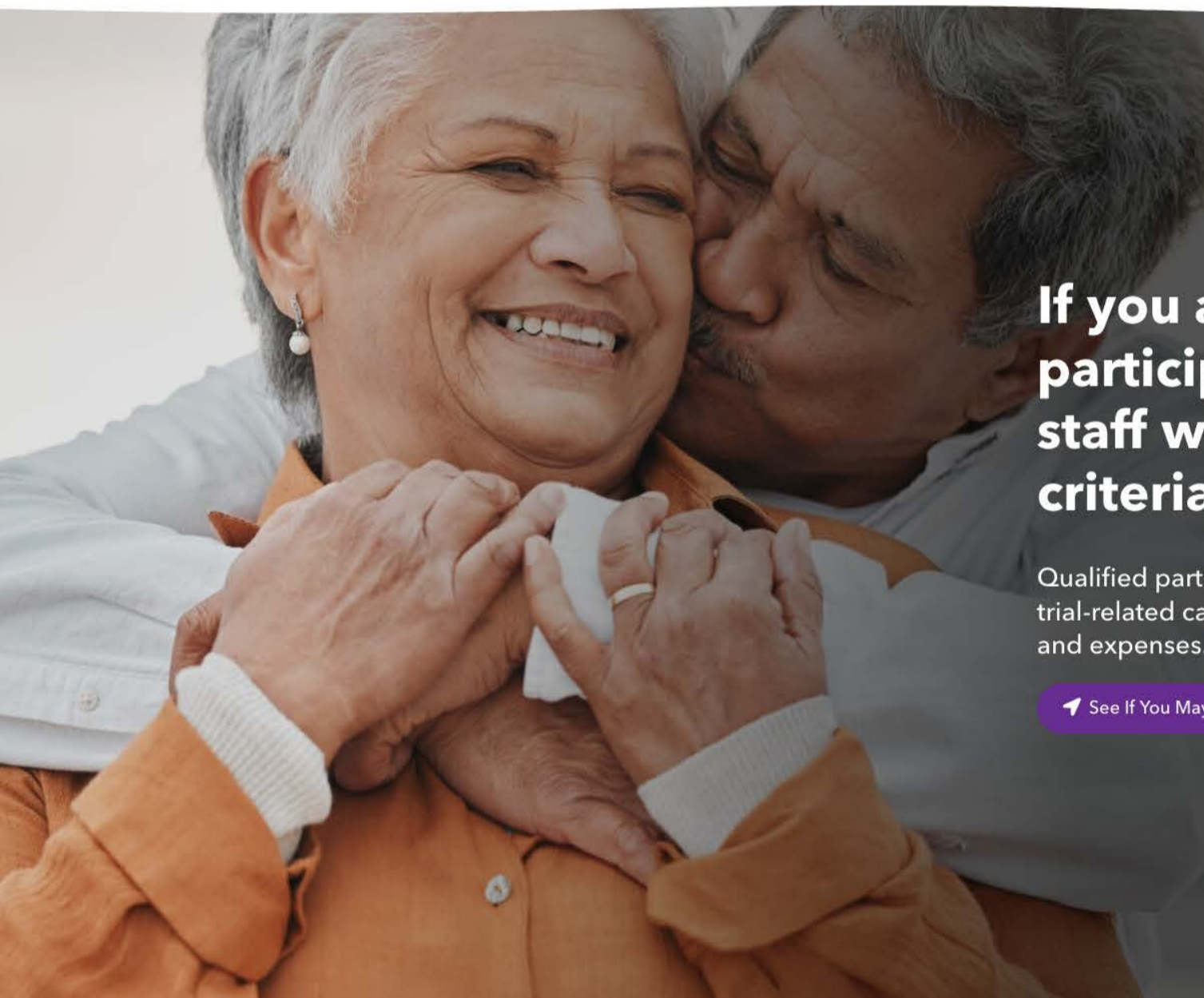
Are between 55 and 85 years of age.



Have experienced confusion or memory loss that has gotten worse over the past year or have been diagnosed with mild to moderate Alzheimer's disease.



Have a willing support person or caregiver who knows you and can attend appointments with you throughout the trial.



If you are interested in participating, the trial doctor or staff will review additional trial criteria with you.

Qualified participants will receive the investigational medication and trial-related care at no cost. Participants may be compensated for travel and expenses.

About Alzheimer's Disease

- ✓ Almost 40% of people will experience some form of memory loss after they turn 65 years old.¹
- ✓ Memory, language, and thinking problems may be caused by changes in the brain that are thought to begin at least 20 years before symptoms appear.²
- ✓ Serious memory problems make it hard to do everyday things like driving, using the phone, and finding the way home.³
- ✓ Normal, age-related forgetfulness, like occasionally forgetting which word to use, is not a sign of serious memory loss.³

We need clinical research to find safe and effective treatment options. This is where the LIFT-AD Trial comes in.

About the LIFT-AD Trial

The LIFT-AD Trial is evaluating the safety and effectiveness of an investigational medication (a medication not approved for routine clinical use) for people with mild to moderate Alzheimer's disease.

The trial involves 9 clinic visits over the course of up to 30 weeks. There is no cost to participate in this study. All study medication and office visits are included at no cost to participants.

Participants are randomly assigned to a treatment group. They receive either the investigational medication or a placebo (a substance that looks like the investigational medication but contains no active ingredients), which is administered through a subcutaneous injection (a small injection under the skin) at home using provided prefilled syringes.

The trial will consist of up to 4 weeks of screening, followed by 26 weeks of trial treatment, and a 4-week safety follow-up period. During the treatment period, the support person or caregiver must be available to supervise the daily administration of the investigational medication.

After completing the LIFT-AD Trial, participants will have the option to join a longer-term open-label extension, which allows all participants to receive the investigational medication.

Alzheimer's disease can be debilitating and have a negative impact on daily life. We need clinical research to find safe and effective treatments.

About Clinical Research

Clinical trials seek to advance and improve treatment options for a variety of conditions, including Alzheimer's disease.

They are designed to answer questions about the safety and effectiveness of potential new medications.

Quick Facts



Clinical research trials must be performed before a new medication or treatment can be approved for use and made available to the general public.



There are common traits that people must have to participate in a trial, called eligibility criteria. Common criteria include age, gender, medical history, and other medical conditions.



Right now, there are more than 400,000 research trials in progress around the world.¹



Many conditions affect diverse groups of people, so it is important to have diverse groups of people participating in research. Different people may respond differently to treatments.

Why Participate?

Taking part in a clinical trial may offer several benefits, including:²

- ✓ Getting actively involved in your own healthcare.
- ✓ Having access to the investigational medication.
- ✓ Helping others by progressing medical research.

Taking part in a clinical trial may also have risks, including:²

- ✓ Having side effects caused by the investigational medication or trial-specific procedures.
- ✓ Having no effect from the investigational medication.
- ✓ Being part of the trial group that doesn't get the investigational medication.
